WHAT: EUROCITIES, the network of Europe's major cities, will gather around 400 delegates including mayors, vice-mayors and local government leaders for its annual conference in Nantes, France on 7-10 November 2012.

The conference theme, 'a new city politics', will explore innovative ways that cities can, and are, better engaging citizens in public policy and planning.

The theme will be addressed through a mayors' debate, offering concrete examples from mayors across Europe, as well as thematic workshops and speednetworking sessions. Participants will be able to see first hand how Nantes is tackling the challenge of citizen engagement and hear directly from local politicians what is happening in their cities.

Nantes will also host the 2012 edition of the prestigious EUROCITIES awards ceremony.

- Joan Font, expert on local participation and political abstention
- Cécile Van de Velde, expert on public youth policies
- Patrick Rimbart, mayor of Nantes
- Frank Jensen, lord mayor of Copenhagen and president of EUROCITIES

The panel debate will be moderated by Max Cotton, a British journalist and broadcaster with 20 years of experience as a political reporter in London.
