11:00	Briefing Privacy and GDPR compliance Privacy Impact Assessment (PIA) process to be used in the workshop
12:00	Presentation of use-cases Cities with a concrete example (service/application/dataset) are invited to share their use-case to the audience (one per city). Four cities (at least) volunteering to present their use-cases to the audience are expected. <i>Example of scenario: bike-sharing scheme, using data from energy sensors in council tenant's homes, smart lamppost, smart citizen card, citizen health card etc.</i> You are encouraged to bring your own scenario!

14:00	Break-out sessions: 'PIA in practice' Participants are divided in groups depending on their concrete examples, expectations or interest. Each group shall appoint a rapporteur for the debriefing.

17:20	Conclusions A short conclusion will be given to participants. One week after the training, an online meeting will be organised as follow-up to present a deepest report on the workshop's learning achievements.

How to reach the venue (Mundo-B, tbc)

By Plane:

From International Airport "Zaventem", take the bus line 12. until Luxembourg square or take the train until Luxembourg station and then walk (approx. 10 mins). If the train to Luxembourg station is not available, take the train to Central station and then the bus (line 71, dir. Delta) and stop at 'Porte de Namur'.

By subway:

Line 2 or 6 metro station 'Porte de Namur' and then walk (approx. 2 min). Metro station 'Trône' is 5 min. walking-distance.

By Train:

From Gare du Midi/Zuid station, take the subway 2 or 6 until "Porte de Namur" station and then walk. From Central station take bus line 71 and stop at 'Porte de Namur'.
