Bristol Dialogue Café

URBAN-NEXUS is an EU-funded project to disseminate research on how smart green cities can be achieved through integrated urban governance. The Bristol Dialogue Café will present the key findings from the synthesis of this research and develop these further through discussion and dialogue with between academics, policy makers and practitioners. This event is the final in a series of Dialogue Cafés hosted by URBAN-NEXUS and will bring together the themes of urban climate resilience, health and quality of life, and competing for urban land into a framework for achieving smart green cities. Dialogue Café delegates from throughout Europe will have the opportunity to hear the state-of-the-art in European research, debate the core issues of smart green cities, visit city-based demonstrations, as well as enjoying the delights of Bristol and its Harbourside.

The Bristol Dialogue Café will see URBAN-NEXUS join forces with the EU-funded Smart Cities Project UrbanAPI to review both research and practical examples of smart urban governance including the demonstration of smart city tools. Bristol City Council as Green European Capital 2015 will also showcase their ground breaking work on smart city living labs.

URBAN-NEXUS is a coordination and support action funded by the European Union under the 7th Framework Programme. The URBAN-NEXUS Consortium consists of 13 core partners, supported by 25 Strategic Partners throughout Europe.

URBAN-NEXUS is developing a Strategic Dialogue and Partnership Framework to support long-term collaboration with stakeholders in relation to the key dimensions of sustainable urban development. The project aims to:

- Identify innovative ways to solve the complex problems that confront sustainable urban development.
- Increase awareness amongst relevant stakeholders and support exchange of knowledge, collaboration and cooperation.
